You need to get noticed because being noticed gives you many opportunities at work for growth. So if you're young, new to the workforce or just want to make a bigger impact at work. Here are some tips that you might want to consider.

1. Meetings.

Meetings are some of the best places for you to get noticed. Most people stay quiet at meetings because well sometimes we think we don't have anything to contribute. But here's a little tip, even if you think you have nothing to contribute, you agree with everything that they say, state your agreement and tell them why. This tells people that you are engaged and that you are present and you're not just feeling bored.

2. Volunteering.

3. Social skills.
